The collection also serves to encourage their creativity. In addition it feeds into the work of introducing medical humanities into Scottish medical schools curricula which is being championed by a group of which the deans of all the medical schools are members -

Poems for doctors is a collaboration between Scottish Poetry Library and the School of Medicine at the University of St Andrews.

A video installation of the readings has also been on site at the School of Medicine in St Andrews and shown to several conferences and seminars.
