MSc STUDENT SELF-DECLARATION

Students in the School of Medicine have certain privileges and responsibilities different from those of other students. A student's behaviour must justify the trust the public places in the medical profession at all times. Students must also be aware that their own poor health may put patients and / or colleagues at risk. For this reason the school requires students to disclose any past or pending criminal proceedings and to bring any significant and relevant personal health issues to the attention of Student Services, the disability officer or the Pro Deans who may refer the students to occupational health if indicated.

Legislation differs by country and police force area. To avoid ambiguity students should report any formal warnings, cautions, fixed penalty awards, fiscal fines or convictions by any court or police forces in any country. The school is well placed to provide advice about the relevance and impact of low level involvement with the police, this is preferable to students attempting to conceal events that may surface later in their careers. Failure to disclose information is viewed seriously. Any information provided will be treated in the strictest confidence.
