

Feedback from staff and students on online teaching and remote exams

Schools and students are currently being consulted on the content and format of new surveys which will be issued shortly in order to get feedback on the experiences of staff and students on digital

teaching and remote examinations. The Assistant Vice-Principal (Diversity) is being consulted on questions relating to wellbeing and workload.

Guidance on changes to Policies and Regulations

A summary of guidance on the key issues which staff and students have queried is now available on the <u>learning remotely</u> and <u>teaching remotely</u> webpages. This covers a wide range of issues such as S coding, honours classification, academic alerts, self-certificates etc.

Schools continue to liaise with PSRBs regarding the adjustments they are making and currently, there does not seem to be any significant cause for concern. A report on PSRB communication containing information gathered from Directors of Teaching has been submitted to the Academic Monitoring Group for review.

Library

As the Library's physical DVD/Audiovisual collections can't be accessed at the moment, a number of alternative multimedia resources have been made available to provide, amongst other material, online films and documentaries. A new area has been added to the Library's Covid-19: Online Resources Guide which lists online multimedia resources for use in teaching and student dissertation work. These include databases such as Digital Theatre plus (which the Library will be promoting on their blog and social media) and new titles bought for Kanopy (on-demand streaming platform).
